## Desert View Schools School Bus Rules/Policy 2023-2024 School Year

In an effort to provide students with the safest possible bus service, the Transportation Department for Desert View Schools has established a basic set of rules for bus behavior. With that in mind, our drivers will be closely monitoring and strictly enforcing the following rules:

### **Bus Rules:**

- 1. Students will demonstrate good character on the bus by following the directions of the bus driver and adhering to all bus rules as well as following the school behavior policy.
- 2. Students must remain properly seated, with their back against the back of the seat, their bottom against the bottom of the seat, and keep their hands to themselves at all times.
- 3. Students will respect one another by not fighting, pushing, or shoving one another.
- 4. Students are not permitted to eat, chew gum or drink on the bus, with exception of water in a plastic container.
- 5. Students will demonstrate good citizenship by not bringing tobacco products or smoking paraphernalia (lighters, matches, etc.) alcohol, drugs or any controlled substances on the bus.
- 6. Students are prohibited from carrying animals, glass objects, hazardous materials, or weapons on the bus.
- 7. Students will respect the rights and safety of their peers by refraining from the use of loud voices, profanity, and/or obscene language or gestures, teasing or bullying.
- 8. Students will demonstrate responsibility by not extending their head, arms, legs or objects out of the bus windows
- 9. Students will be completely silent at railroad crossings.
- 10. Students will be responsible when exiting the bus upon door signal.
- 11. Students will not tamper with bus equipment.
- 12. Students will help maintain the bus in a clean and safe condition.

#### Prohibited Items on the School Bus

- 1. Bats, hockey sticks, golf clubs
- 2. Skateboards
- 3. Glass Items
- Animals
- 5. Weapons of any kind (guns, knives, nun chucks), etc.
- 6. Food or drinks (except water in a plastic container)
- 7. Flammable Items of any nature (lighters, fireworks, cigarettes, deodorant sprays, body mists etc.)
- 8. Miscellaneous item(s) as deemed to be unsafe or threatening to students is at the discretion of school personnel/driver.

### **Desert View Schools Bus Policy**

- Desert View Schools is happy to provide transportation options to our parents. We want to remind you that transportation is a privilege provided for students. Our transportation options are limited, meaning we offer space on our bus system as it is available on a first-come, first-served basis.
  Failure to comply with rules may result in loss of bus privileges. Please refer to our S.O.A.R. document for details.
- 2. The safety of our students is our number one priority! Please note that supervision is not provided for students at any of our bus stops. For safety precautions, please do not leave your child unattended. Parents are encouraged to arrive 10-15 minutes prior to scheduled departure time.
- 3. We understand there may be a need to change your transportation schedule. We ask parents to provide a written note to the Transportation Coordinator regarding any transportation change.
- 4. Because of our wait lists for transportation, we ask that parents with transportation privileges utilize them as much as possible. Therefore, students who do not ride their assigned bus at least 4 days in a full school week (3 days in a school week with less than 5 days) will incur an absence week. Students who have 4 absence weeks in a school year may have bus privileges revoked. Note-For this requirement, a bus absence is defined as a day that the student DID attend school for the entire day but DID NOT ride the bus both to/from school that day.

## Let's S.O.A.R. (Safely, Orderly And Respectfully) on the school bus!

To protect the safety (physical and emotional) of each individual student on the bus and to develop busriding behaviors that will be relevant and meaningful when the student is out in the community, student behaviors are expected to be **safe**, **orderly and respectful**. If they are not, the following matrices will be followed:

#### Level 1

(These misbehaviors are handled by the bus driver.)

- \*Eating, drinking, chewing gum on the bus
- \*Not sitting in assigned seat
- \*Out of seat without permission while bus in motion or sitting improperly
- \*Yelling and screaming
- \*Consistently showing disrespect to fellow students and/or school employee
